This terms topic is: 'This is me'		What you can do at home

We will be creating patterns, talking about size and weight and finding one more and one less than a given number.</li> <li>Year One will be counting and writing numbers to 10, counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, using number bonds to 20 and solving missing number maths problems.</li> <li>Year Two will be looking at numbers to 100 and reading and writing them in words. Science	<ul> <li>Animals including Humans         In Science we will be learning about the human body, naming our body parts and learning about our senses.         We will be comparing ourselves to animals and looking at similarities and differences.         We will be looking at diets, food groups and healthy eating.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Study your pet at home. What is similar and different about them to ourselves?</li> <li>Compare yourself to other members of your family. What is similar and different about you all?</li> <li>Keep a food diary and see what sorts of food you eat in a week.</li> </ul>
Topic	<ul> <li>In Topic we are covering a number of subjects. We will be looking at fashion and toys from the past. What was it like to live a long time ago? What is different today?</li> <li>We are also using Family History to guide our study this term. We hope that by the children getting to know their ancestors, and their history, that we will develop a human understanding of periods in history. Our specific focus will be around WW2 and would appreciate any related family history that you could provide your child with.</li> <li>We will be exploring the magical world of body percussion, and will be taking inspiration from beat-boxers in order to compose our own</li> </ul>	• Create a family tree — see homework book.

	music. We will also be looking at music from around the world and how this global music place influences modern artists.	
Art & DT	<ul> <li>We are looking at ourselves, making selfportraits. This will include investigating portraits by a variety of artists and exploring the use of objects to convey meaning in a portrait. The children will investigate a range of drawing media and the marks they can make. They will then record self-portraits from observation and explore how colour can be used to convey moods and emotions. They will also create a portrait sculpture.</li> <li>This term there will be a strong link to the Art curriculum through Forest School. We will be learning about using different tools and techniques in the outdoor environment and making links to the work of famous artist, Gustav Klimt and his piece 'Tree of Life'.
