What you can do at home

English

Traditional tales: We will look at writing an alternative version of a fairy-tale.

Persuasion: We will have a debate about a controversial area before structuring a written argument about our chosen topic.

Book Study: We will read the Snow Queen as a class before exploring characters, settings and events through discussion and writing.

Measurement: The children will consolidate their knowledge of perimeter and area working with different metric measurements of length.

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	subtraction of fractions with the same denominators moving onto different denominators for Year 5. We will compare and order fractions and develop skills for creating and recognising equivalent fractions. The children will use their multiplication and division skills to find fractions of amounts. Mass and capacity: We will explore the different units for measuring mass and capacity and develop skills for converting between units of measurement.	 Talk about fractions in practical contexts eg sharing sweets, cutting a cake or pizza. Keep an eye out for adverts using percentages eg in the sales or adverts in newspapers.
	Decimals: Children will develop the skills for multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. They will add and subtract tenths and hundredths within one whole. In Y5 the children will begin to explore percentages using their knowledge of fractions and decimals.	
Science	Properties and Changes of Materials: We will look at the different states of matter. We will explore the process of changing state by looking at melting, freezing, evaporation and condensation. We will look at reversible and irreversible changes. We will explore materials as insulators relating to clothing that may be worn in the polar regions.	 Discuss any evidence that you see of the water cycle and the process of evaporation and condensation. Look at real life explorers of the Arctic and Antarctic.
	We will focus on the skill of measuring temperature using a thermometer and recording our measurements accurately.	
Geography	We will identify and name the continents of the world and will look at different countries in terms of their climate and how it affects life there. We will explore the ways of life of the Inuit and Nenets.	• To look at books or watch television programmes that show what life in polar regions is like.
