



How have Cheswardine Primary School spent their 2018-2019 Sports Premium Government Funding and what is the plan for 2019-20?

This Government funding is to be used purely on Physical Education. Schools can:

- Employ experts to train staff to have more expertise and confidence in delivering PE in schools
- Raise pupil achievement in PE lessons
- Develop more extra-curricular sports clubs
- Inspire children who are not yet engaging with PE
- Take part in more competitions
- Purchase more resources
- Support the leadership and management of PE
- Work in closer partnership with other schools

£10496	Sports coaches – 1 x CPD for staff per class, 1 x gym coach, 2 x after school coaching, 1 x lunch club 1 x activesports coaching.	As a school for this period we have been able to enter various sports competitions. We participated in cross country, netball, basketball, swimming, rounders, unihoc and dodgeball competitions. One of our cross country athletes was overall Shropshire winner in year 4. We were able to provide all KS2 children swimming lessons at the local pool. Children have gained a greater confidence within the water and many achievement badges are completed. The children entering into competitions have developed greater team work, developed strategies for team play, coping with defeat and success.
£1880	Transport to events and swimming	The school have actively looked for extra sport providers to enhance the teaching of other sports.
£1771	Resources	An inter-school sports event was held at Cheswardine in July encouraging social interactions and wider teamwork opportunities as well as healthy competition.
£665	Swimming	Safety scene work was accessed for Year 6 building on how to stay healthy and safe in our modern society.
£1325	Support and admin costs for events.	The school have gained the Silver award from the Youth Games. Outdoor activities were accessed for Year 6 and Y5/6 residential was supported using the Sports grant. Both these enabled the building of teamwork and resilience as well as trying new outdoor activities and overcoming fears.
