Parents' Contingency Plan for Remote Learning:

In the event of a future lockdown and return to remote learning the Federation has planned a full programme of provision that the children will need to access and parents will need to commit to in order to ensure children keep on top of their learning and avoid any learning gaps widening.

We will aim to support parents and pupils as much as possible if this occurs and we want to make it totally clear for staff, parents and pupils what will be expected throughout the week in order for the curriculum to be covered in the best way possible.

In the event of your child having to isolate their teacher will guide you as to the most useful links on the **home learning page** of each school's website. This has a variety of links which when followed will enable you to support your child and keep up to date with the topics being covered in school, particularly in the core subjects. This will be particularly useful if your child is healthy but has to isolate due to a household member showing symptoms or testing positive.

In the event of a positive test within the school, Public Health Shropshire and the DFE will be notified and the school will be guided into who needs to isolate and who doesn't. It will not necessarily be an immediate action but will be a considered response to risk assessment questions they will give us. The school will always follow the advice given and advise parents appropriately.

Each child will be given a **remote learning book** to record any learning done at home and respond to the tasks set. This can also be used for homework tasks which are presently set on line. In the event of a more local or indeed a wider lockdown the children will be sent home with their **English and Maths books** so that expectations are clear to parents when they are signposted to the tasks. We are also investigating appropriate Maths text books which could be sent home but primarily downloading activities or viewing them online and responding to them in the remote learning book or online will be the expectation. Activity packs will not be available on mass and teachers will be asked to set the tasks on the website, provide daily videos and lessons online through MS Teams rather than produce packs and send them out.



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Tasks won't all need to be completed online, as we don't want to promote too much screen time but will be accessed each day from the website. As all parents we know have access to phones and /or tablets this should be achievable although I would recommend looking into other resources such as a laptop / chromebook to support your child going forward through their school career. In the event of another lockdown we would aim to support those pupils who are pupil premium and are in large families where sharing resources is tricky, each case will be looked at on an individual basis and according to DFE guidance.

Key Stage 1 have already been issued with Letters and Sounds booklets which will help with any phonic tasks and vocabulary the teacher may use when explaining tasks. These can be worked through and used to support progress through the KS1 curriculum very effectively. Year 6 will be issued with revision booklets in Maths and English as we go through the year and these are also useful and will be something the teachers will draw on if a lockdown happens further down the line.

I seriously hope that we do not have to close the school at all over the course of the year however I never thought I'd see schools close earlier in this year and they did. I think teachers, pupils and parents did a sterling job of coping over lockdown as you all faced enormous challenges and I do fully realise how difficult it will be if the same thing reoccurs, especially if many of you are back in the workplace. However I hope that the guidance and plans set out here will give you some reassurance that we are prepared and if we all work together I know we can achieve some type of consistency for the children and make sure that they are given the best chance we can possibly give them in impossible circumstances. Teachers are working hard to put together 'self-help' videos to guide you in logging onto sites and supporting your children which should be on our websites soon and of course the admin emails are manned daily from 8:30-3:30pm and we will get you the support you need as quickly as we can.

I know I have emphasised commitment to the routines set out here but there will be barriers to achieving them so please remember all you have to do is ask for help and don't suffer in silence!!
