

Craft Instructions

Diwali Kandil Lantern

Supplies

- Coloured card
- Shiny paper (or tin foil)
- Glitter
- Acrylic jewels
- Tissue paper
- Scissors
- Small paintbrush
- Glue
- Sticky tape
- Hole punch
- Ribbon



1

First, choose a colour of card for the body of your lantern and cut this to approx. A5 size. Place on the table, with the shorter sides at the top and bottom.

Next, cut out a slightly thinner rectangle from shiny paper (or tin foil). Stick this onto the A5 piece of card, leaving a small border at the top and bottom.

Next, cut 2 squares of coloured card about 10cm in length.

Rotate a square to make a diamond shape and stick onto the lantern base with one corner at the centre of the lantern and the opposite corner over the side of the lantern. Repeat by sticking the other square, like a diamond, next to the first - slightly overlapping the corners in the centre of the lantern.

Next, cut some strips of coloured tissue paper and attach them to the back of the lantern, at the bottom, using some sticky tape.

Finally, decorate the front of the lantern with some glitter and acrylic jewels.

Next, punch a hole near the top of the lantern and thread some ribbon through to hang your lantern up.

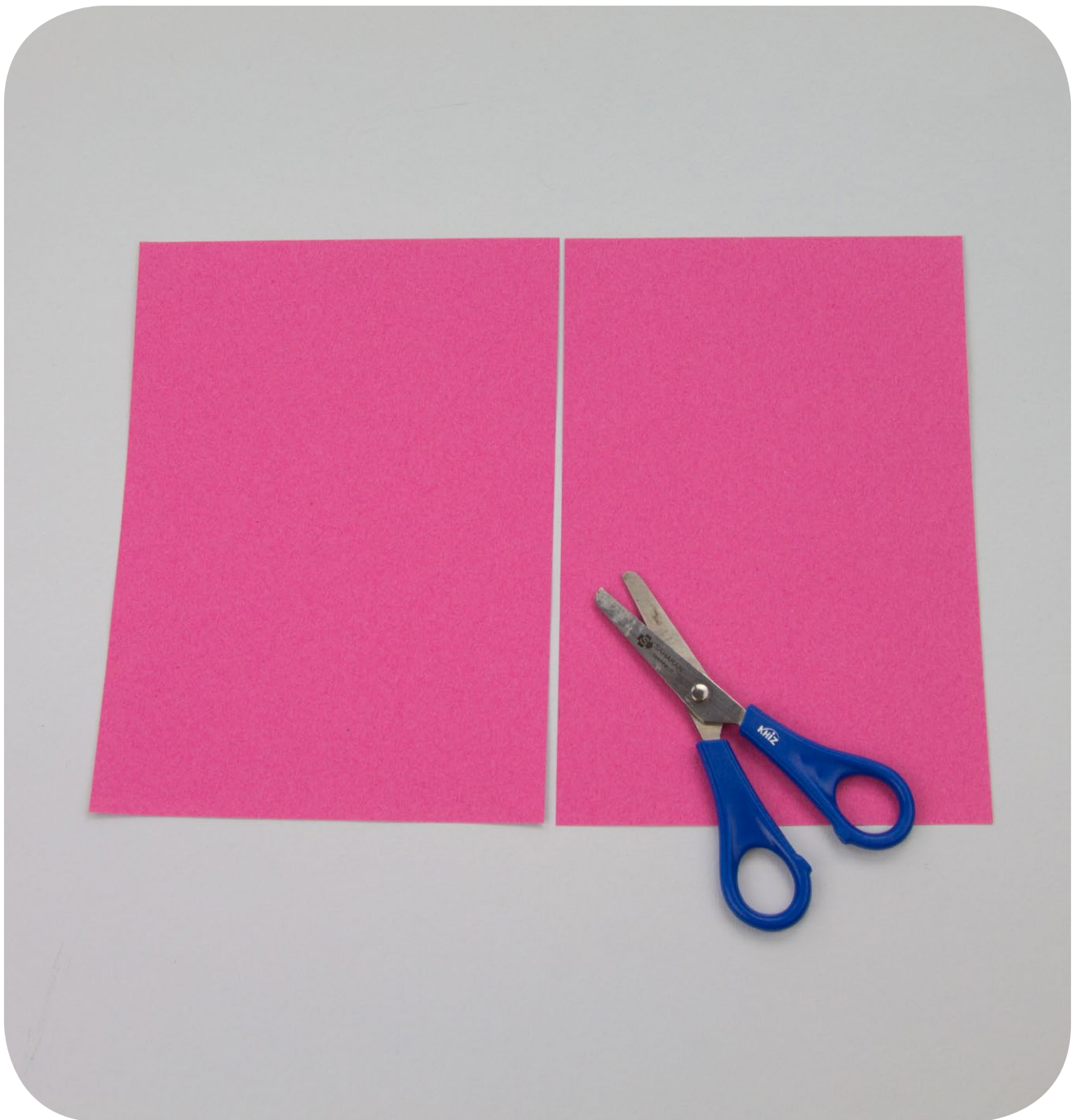
Diwali Kandil Lantern



Supplies

- Coloured card
- Shiny paper (or tin foil)

- Acrylic jewels
- Tissue paper

Step 1. First, choose a colour of card for the body of your lantern and cut this to approx. A5 size. Place on the table, with the shorter sides at the top and bottom.



Step 2. Next, cut out a slightly thinner rectangle from shiny paper (or tin foil). Stick this onto the A5 piece of card, leaving a small border at the top and bottom.



Step 3. Next, cut 2 squares of coloured card about 10cm in length.

**Step 4.**

Rotate a square to make a diamond shape and stick onto the lantern base with one corner at the centre of the lantern and the opposite corner over the side of the lantern. Repeat by sticking the other square, like a diamond, next to the first – slightly overlapping the corners in the centre of the lantern.



- Step 5. Next, cut some strips of coloured tissue paper and attach them to the back of the lantern, at the bottom, using some sticky tape.



Step 6. Next, punch a hole near the top of the lantern and thread some ribbon through to hang your lantern up.



Step 7. Finally, decorate the front of the lantern with some glitter and acrylic jewels.
