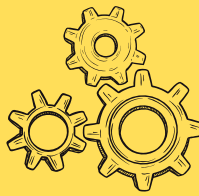




HUGO CABRET: NARRATIVE



RECAP

Adverbs to describe verbs.

Simple narratives use typical characters, settings and events

Accurate sentence demarcation including exclamations, question marks, capital letters and full stops.

CRUCIAL KNOWLEDGE

The purpose of narrative: to tell a story that entertains the reader

Explore the character of Hugo and his thoughts and feelings.

Use story boarding to sequence events and to structure their story.

Use speech and reporting clauses to indicate feelings and actions.

GPS

Fronted adverbials can show when, how or where something took place e.g. During the night..., In a distant field.... These should be punctuated using a comma.

Use inverted commas to punctuate speech.

KEY VOCABULARY

Third Person	Writing from the writer's perspective using the pronouns 'I', 'we', 'me' and 'us'.
Reporting Clause	A reporting clause tells you who has spoken, e.g. 'He replied'
Inverted commas	"" Punctuation that is put around a word or phrase to show that someone else has said it.

Paragraphs	If the time, person, topic or place changes it is time to start a new paragraph.
Fronted Adverbial	An adverbial is a word or phrase that is used as an adverb to give you more information about a verb or clause.
Adverbial	when the adverbial word or phrase is moved to the front of the sentence
